Oak Newsletter Autumn 2023


This term the St Mary's children are being taught using a new learning scheme called CUSP*. It is an exciting programme of learning which provides excellent coverage of the Primary Curriculum. In Oak, we start our History topic with the Ancient Greeks and learn about them through artefacts, myths and written recordings.

Science this term is investigating the properties of all kinds of materials and creating some investigations to help understand why specific materials are used for specific purposes. We will also learn about life cycles of animals including humans. In Music we will learn songs linked to our seasons and festivals and also a range of modern pop songs.


Children will have an opportunity

Please ensure your child comes to school every day in school uniform. We are heading into changeable weather so make sure they have appropriate clothing to keep them cool or warm or dry.
