#### This week in class...

**Ash Class** - In Ash Class this week, we have been reading, *Rubbish, Don't throw it away*. A book which explores reducing, reusing and recycling our rubbish. It gave us lots of ideas for up-cycling projects including making animal masks from old paper plates and owls from pine cones as well as making art with leaves. We did not make a pond from an old sink, but we did think about animals that live in ponds and learned about the life cycle of a frog. It has linked well with our science work on how to take care of our local environment. In maths, we have been beginning to add by combining two groups of objects and have explored and compared length. We have been learning about physical and human features in geography and have learned more about the explorer, Ernest Shackleton in history.

**Elm Class** - Elm class have been noticing changes as our sunflowers start to grow. They are so excited to take them home and care for them and we look forward to seeing their plants blossom. We have had lots of interesting discussions this week in Reading. We are thinking about the importance of 'looking up' as our character suggests. We are making our own meteor showers and wondering how they appear when we 'look up'.

**Beech Class** - Beech Class have been assembling their final pieces in art this week and can't wait to share them. In our music lessons we have started to learn our performance piece for the end of term. We have also been enjoying calculating perimeter in maths and Year 4s had an enjoyable muddy morning in Woodland Learning.

**Willow Class** - This week in Willow Class we have enjoyed finishing our class book, 'Sam Wu is not afraid of the dark'. We thought about what we are afraid of and how we would have felt if we were a character in the story. We have been reading this book for several weeks and have been developing our reading skills answering questions about the characters, setting and plot. With two special days this week we also created a collage pancake, sharing our favourite toppings and talked about who we love in our lives.

**Oak Class** - Oak have had a great week and really enjoyed making bread and Thai-style wraps. We have started on our Midsummer Night's Dream text and really enjoyed reading and making a story map of the main elements of the plot. Science was also interesting - we learned how pulley systems (sticks, a long rope, strong arms) change the force necessary to pull apart two sticks. Adding multiple loops to act as pulleys make the sticks much easier to pull apart.
