This week in class...

Ash Class - We have enjoyed another busy and fun-filled week in Ash class. We have been reading, The Story of Orchestra: Carnival of the Animals. We have been learning about the animals that we meet in the story and have talked about the music that goes with each part of the story. We dug for fossils in the sand tray, fished and identified sea creatures from a water table, made lion masks and made some under the sea inspired art and crafts. We are continuing to read our Green books in phonics and have been writing whole sentences! In maths, we have been focusing on exploring and representing the numbers 9 and 10. We really enjoyed our World Book Day activities and shared our favourite books and stories in class.

Elm Class - Elm class were very excited about World Book day and many children brought in books to share and talk about. In our reading lesson we learnt to retrieve using annotations today and the children found out some amazing facts about constellations.

Beech Class - In Beech Class this week we have continued to investigate our work on levers. We discovered that by moving the fulcrum closer to the load of 5 marbles you only need 1 marble to lift the load. When we moved the fulcrum closer to the effort you needed 30 marbles to lift the load. Using this information, we investigated the length of the lever on catapults and discovered that a longer lever was better but it couldn't be too long.

Oak Class - Oak Class have had a busy week as usual this week. We have been learning about space, this week about the moon. Did you know that if you live in Australia, you see the same phases of the moon, just the opposite way around? We really enjoyed the reading cafe in class and especially talking about books to parents, carers and our friends. In PE, for the first time, we had a go of Ultimate Frisbee. That was really fun!
