#### This week in class...

**Ash Class -** In Ash class this week we have been reading *Mr Wolf's Pancakes*. In it Wolf learns how to do lots of tasks related to making pancakes, all by himself. On Tuesday, we made pancakes with Mrs Pestell and ate them with sugar and lemon or with jam. They were delicious! Just like Mr Wolf we have written a shopping list, followed a recipe and role played shopping, cooking and washing up. The story has also linked to maths as we have been learning language to order and sequence steps or activities in time. We have used words such as first, next, now and finally. We have also practiced using days of the week vocabulary to describe our weekly activities at home and at school. In R.E. we have started to learn about Easter and the significance of the cross to Christians.

**Elm Class** - Elm class have started a new and exciting book this week. "Here we are" by Oliver Jeffers is a colourful and exciting guide to living on planet Earth. The children are learning lots of vocabulary and enjoy sharing their thoughts on this fabulous text. We continue to nurture our sunflowers and are sharing our tips for helping them to grow, from adding egg shells to prevent slugs to using lolly sticks to support the stem. Our class plants are enjoying the sunshine too. We have started a new RE enquiry this week and have been thinking about the importance of the cross to Christians, and how it is represented in different ways in art, music and dance. We have also been thinking about the different things we need to do in order to stay healthy, and learnt an action poem to help us remember.

**Beech Class** - This week Beech class have started to learn about lots of new topics. In reading we have started Operation Gadgetman, in science we are learning about plants and in DT we are learning about levers and linkages.

**Willow Class** - This week in the willow room we enjoyed exploring different nests when we went out to woodland learning and playing a new version of rock paper scissors, called giants, trolls and wizards. We have also started our new class text 'Operation Gadget Man' which made us think about what we would include in a spy kit!

**Oak Class -** This week in Oak we started a new topic in Geography. We looked at OS maps and explored where we lived and recognised landmarks and geographical features. We also located our homes on Google Map which was really enjoyable. We also enjoyed/were challenged by the twists and turns in the plot of a Midsummer Night's Dream, which we are writing a synopsis of. We are really looking forward to our residential!
