This week in class...

Ash Class - This week in Ash Class, we have been learning about animal life cycles, linked to our class reader, Tad', about a clever little tadpole on her journey to becoming a frog. We have focused on the life cycles of frogs and butterflies as they undergo, metamorphosis. We have explored the use of colour in the illustrations of our story. We have painted with dark, murky colours to represent 'Big Glub', a big fish at the bottom of the pond, and with bright colours to represent the colourful world out of the pond. In maths, we have been sharing and grouping objects and practising our number formation.

Beech Class - In Beech class this week we have started the new topic of time in maths. The year 4s have been practising hard for their times tables assessment this week. In history we have been debating whether Boudicca and the Celts or the Picts from Scotland were successful when trying to resist the Roman invasion.

Elm Class - Elm class became scientists on Thursday afternoon by observing and recording the number of wild plants growing in a randomly chosen area over 3 different locations. They worked in groups, counting the varieties of plants and tallying their results. We then discussed which plants were the most common.

Oak Class - In Oak Class this week. We have begun to learn how to write playscripts. With this in mind, children went into small groups and performed a short extract. This was amusing and the children really enjoyed it. Next we will write our own short scene and perform that .. no doubt there will be many laughs. Several children from Oak Class participated in an internal Kwik Cricket tournament .. which we won! We have another great trophy to show for that. In maths, Year 6 have been finding the mean of different sets of number. See if they can still remember what they need to do to find the mean of, for instance, the age of everyone in their family.










Family Maths - St Mary's
