This week in class...

Ash Class - This week Ash Class have been thinking about Autumn. They have been on a leaf hunt and looked for signs of autumn in the environment. We have started learning about 2D shapes and their properties. The children were very brave and performed their Harvest Song in church for the first time and they were amazed at how big the church was!

Elm Class - This week Elm Class have been thinking about individual responses to our RE enquiry for this half term. We have been talking about all of the things we have learnt about Hanukkah, Diwali and Christmas, and then considering how and why light is an important part of all three of these festivals. In our Writing sessions we have been finishing off retelling the story of 'The Three Billy Goats Gruff'. We thought about using descriptive language, and trying to use some of the vocabulary found in the story in our own work.

Beech Class - Beech Class have had another busy week. Last Friday afternoon we had an Anglo-Saxon experience with Mrs Denmark. We learned how to build a fire and tried vegetable stew. Then we gathered more firework because Anglo-Saxon children had jobs to do. Finally, we made some daub for the wattle frame. Real daub would have used horse poo but we used clay instead. After the daub dance, where we mixed the clay poo and straw together, we spread it onto the frame to fill in the gaps. On Monday we wrote all about our Anglo-Saxon experience. Sadly, we waved goodbye to Jonas today wishing him a safe journey home.

Oak Class - What a busy week at school we have had! The children have excelled in their learning all term and deserve a rest. The two Harvest Celebration services went extremely well and the children performed wonderfully, as usual.
