This week in class...

Ash Class - This week in Ash Class we have been reading, I Am (Nearly) Always Kind. We have talked about what kindness is and how important it is. We have also talked about it not always being easy to be kind, especially when we disagree with someone and we have shared ways that we can overcome these difficulties. We also shared our own experiences of kindness - both being kind to others and others being kind to us. In maths we have been finding, subitising and representing the numbers 4 and 5 as well as finding 1 more than a number up to 4. In phonics we have focused on the sounds: e, I, h and qu and have started reading our first, 'Ditty sheet'. We learned about Guy Fawkes and the origins of Bonfire Night while also learning about fire and firework safety. We have created some firework and bonfire artwork using paint, pastels and collage.

Beech Class - In Beech class this week we have been cooking. Our big question was What is really in our food? To answer this, we have been comparing common shop bought food with homemade food. We have made pizza, bread rolls and tomato soup. We all agreed that our homemade food was really tasty. When we compared the ingredients of our recipes with mass produced food we discovered there was more salt and sugar. There were also a lot of ingredients we had never heard of.

Oak Class - Oak Class have returned after the half term, ready to learn! We are continuing our speech writing and have listened to many persuasive arguments about who the best footballer ever is; why you shouldn't tie your dog up in extreme weather and why going on safari could have a negative impact on the wildlife you are going to see.
